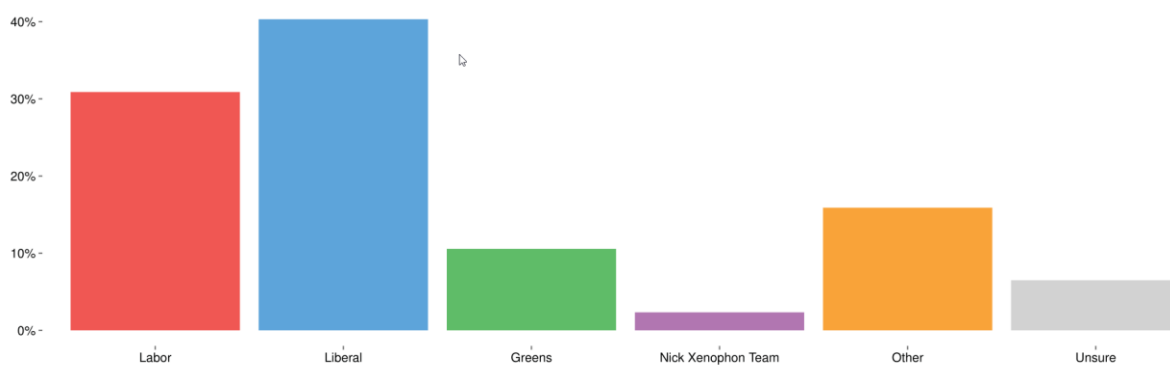
Introduction

This document summarises the results of a poll conducted across Australia for the Campaign for Australian Aid, between the 21st and the 23rd of June 2016. Selective sampling techniques with a tolerance of 3% were used to obtain a geographically balanced sample. The sample error for this poll is 3.3% with a confidence interval of 95%.

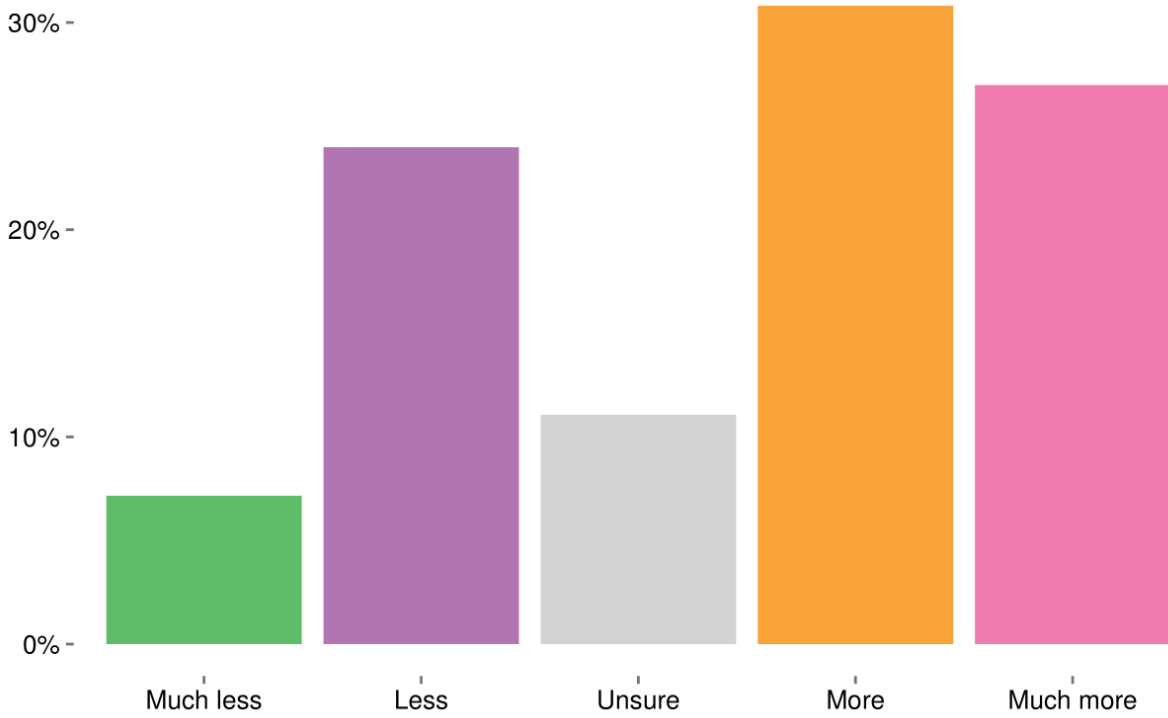

Do you think Australia should be doing more to help end global poverty?

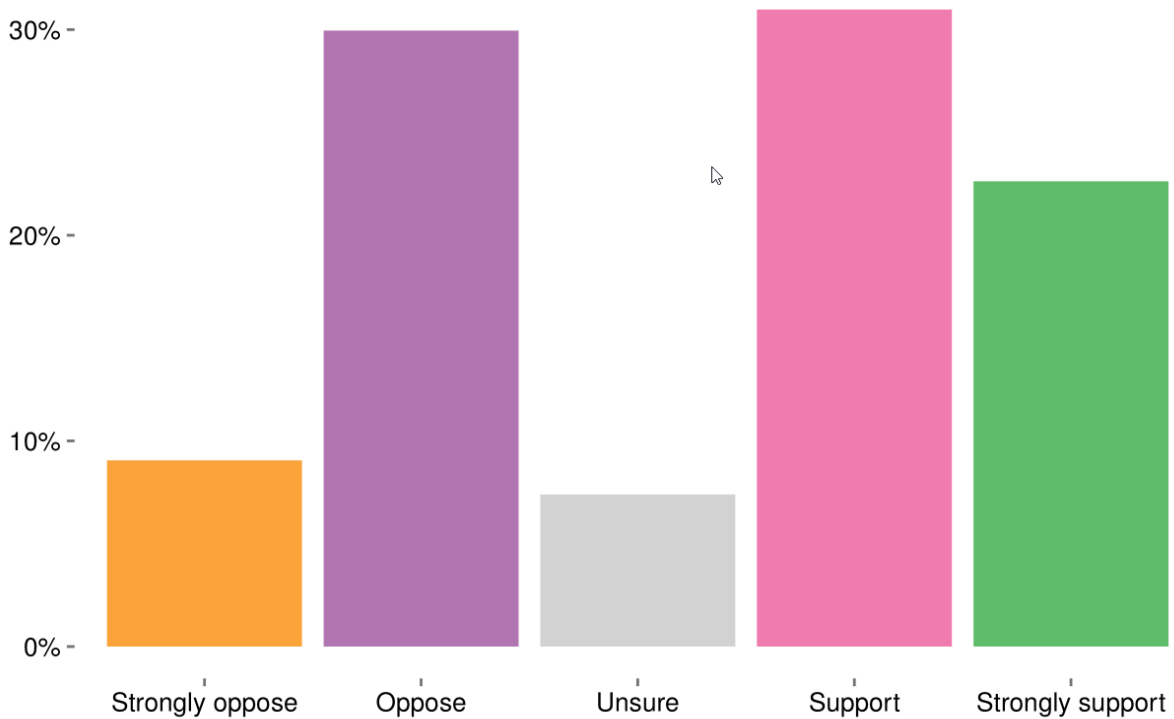
